Microsoft U Turn for Microsoft 365

Microsoft previously announced Windows 10 users support for Microsoft 365 apps would finish on 14 October 2025.

Although support for Windows 10 users will cease on 14th October 2025 unless you pay \$30 for a one year extension, support i.e. security updates for Microsoft 365 apps including Word, Excel, Teams, Outlook, and OneDrive will continue until October 2028.

Google's "Scam Detection" in Google
Messages has been expanded and will provide
alerts for crypto scams, financial impersonation,
gift card and prize scams, technical support
scams and more. The AI security features run
locally on users' devices and do not share data
or message content. Android now detects about
2 billion suspicious messages a month.



Beware of this **Facebook scam** 'Al Video Tools'

This new cyber scam uses legitimate looking ads on Facebook for fake AI tools. The ads aim to trick users by prompting them to upload an image or video for the Ai tool to generate content. The downloaded content is a zip file with malicious software. The malware is the type designed to steal browser passwords and crypto data.

Using Safari as a primary browser

An article by Raul comments on a few tricks to make a better overall experience like,

⇒ Copy Links to all web pages in a tab group

Long press a tab group name and tap "Copy N Links" to copy links to all opened web pages in the group. Then paste all copies of links as usual anywhere.

⇒ Quickly toggle Reader mode

Long press the address bar options on the left to toggle between regular and reader mode.

⇒ View the navigation history of the active tab

Long press the back button on a tab to show the entire navigation history for that tab. Tapping an item in the list takes you back to that previously opened web page

⇒ View recently closed tabs

Long press the new tab button to view all recently closed tabs. Tapping an item in the list reopens the closed tab.

Editor: Safari is a free web browser installed on Apple devices. A version is available for Windows devices, but an updated version isn't.

Orion browser—Mac and iOS



Passwords to Passkeys Microsoft

Microsoft has begun replacing passwords with passkeys.

A passkey is facial recognition, fingerprint scans or PINs and signing into an account with passkeys (32%) is three times more successful than signing in with a password (98%).

From the 1st May 2025 the default for new users signing into their account will be a passkey. They are more secure then passwords and less vulnerable to phishing or data breaches and you don't have to remember a complex password.

Existing Microsoft account users can still log in using passwords but the device will prompt the user to use the "best available method on your account".

Microsoft want everyone signed up with PIN numbers or biometrics.

Extend Phone Battery Life

There is a feature in settings on Samsung phones called Power Saving Mode. Its recognized that charging your battery to 100% reduces battery life so you can customize how your phone uses power via options that limit CPU speed, reduce brightness and turn off Always On Display, etc. On my phone I'm able to set the phone to one

On my phone I'm able to set the phone to one of three settings Basic, Adaptive, or Maximum. Maximum charges the phone to 80%.

iPhone and iPads

Low Power Mode temporarily reduces background activity to extend battery life when the battery level gets low.

Hide Google AI Overviews

If you don't like the AI overviews on Google search you can stop them.

The browser extension **Hide Google AI overviews** can be used. It removes the AI generated overviews and is available in the chrome web store.

Dual boot bug fixed
